Dear Sierra Grande Community, Staff, Parents and Students,



A bit of information.....

WHAT TO DO REMINDERS

My son/daughter is absent from school.

Call the school and inform Mrs. Arellano that your son/daughter is absent due to illness, doctor appointment, etc. the same day of the absence. If you do not have a phone or are unable to call, send a written note with your student the day they return and have him/her come to the office to get an "Admitt Slip". If you do not call or send a note, your child's absence will remain unexcused. Please refer to the Student/Parent Handbook relating to "Excused" absence reasons. The phone number is 379-8257.

My son/daughter needs to ride a different bus home today.

Send a note with your son/daughter and have him/her take it to the front office for a "Bus Permit" pass. If you need to call, please call before 3:00 p.m. This will allow the front office time to contact teachers and transportation to ensure your child gets to the correct destination after school.

My son/daughter in elementary wants to attend an after-school event.

A parent or guardian needs to accompany your K-6 student to all after school events including sports events, concerts, plays, and all extra-curricular activities. No K-6 student will be allowed to attend any event by themselves. All K-6 students will be sent home on the bus and will not be able to wait at the school for parents to join them if a game starts at 4:30 or later.

My son/daughter wants to use the school phone.

Students are to use the school phone in the event of emergencies only. They will not be allowed to call home for homework they have forgotten, to stay after school, go to a friend's house, etc. Students are prohibited to use the telephone in the classroom.

My son/daughter was absent and needs their homework.

It is the student's responsibility to get homework from his/her teacher while he/she was absent. The student will have one day for every day he/she was absent to make up the assigned homework. Parents/Guardians please understand if you call in for homework for your son/daughter that teachers are teaching and will not be able to get the homework ready when you call at the last moment. Please be considerate. If you must call, call in the morning and pick up your son/daughter's homework in the afternoon.

CYBER BULLYING

Cyberbullying is sending or posting harmful or cruel text or images using the Internet or other digital communication devices. This can include sending cruel or threatening e-mails or text messages, creating Web sites that insult other people, posting degrading pictures of another person on the Web, and breaking into an e-mail or Instant Message account to send hurtful or embarrassing material to other people.

TOO TIRED TO LEARN

Research has shown a clear relationship between sleep deprivation and academic performance and learning difficulties. It has been known for many years those children with large tonsils or adenoids may have difficulty sleeping. But the association between these disordered sleep patterns and school behavior problems, such as inattention and hyperactivity has only recently been discovered. One researcher has estimated that 25 percent of children who have been diagnosed with ADHD could have the problem eliminated if their sleep-related breathing disorders were treated. Research has evidence that children who do not get enough sleep have behavior problems, learning difficulties and perform below grade level. Parents need to put their children to bed earlier. All kindergartners need at least eleven hours of sleep every night and all 1st-6th graders need nine hours of sleep each night. It is easy to improve behavior, student achievement and learning difficulties by having enough sleep every night.

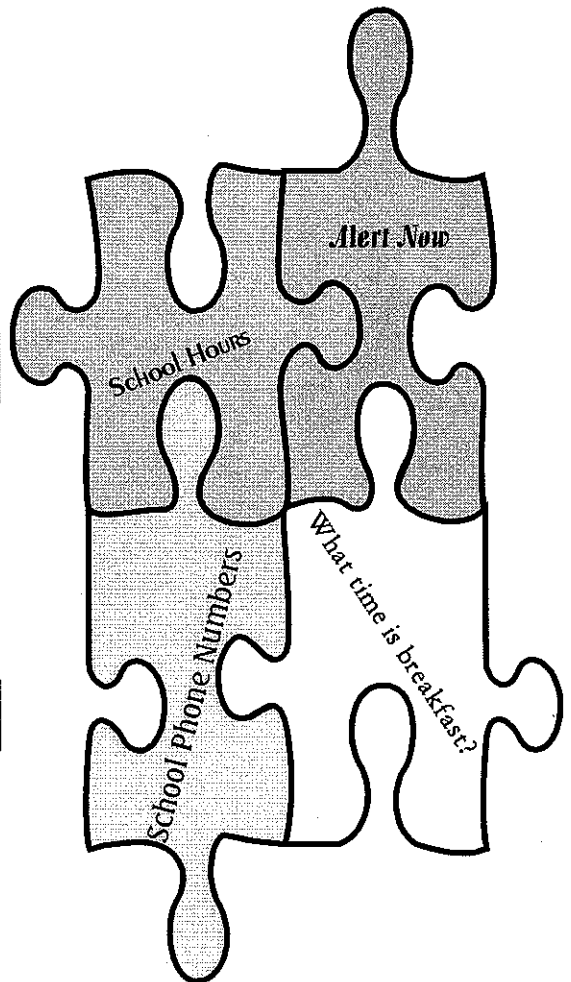

ALERT NOW

Sierra Grande School District has an automated telephone system known as Alert Now. It is important that when filling out the registration forms for your children, a current telephone number is on file so that when we need to send informational messages via the telephone, you will receive the message. NOTICE TO PARENTS*

To: All Parents
From: Sierra Grande School District
Date: July 19, 2011

As a parent of a student at Sierra Grande you have the right to know the professional qualifications of the classroom teacher who instructs your child. This is a requirement for all districts that receive Title I funds. Federal law allows you to request certain information about your student's classroom teacher. The law also requires the district to give you this information in a timely manner upon request. Listed below is the information about which you have the right to ask for regarding each of your student's classroom teachers.

- Whether the Colorado Department of Education (CDE) has licensed or endorsed your student's teacher for the grades and subjects taught.
- Whether CDE has decided that your student's teacher can teach in a classroom without being licensed or qualified under state regulations because of special circumstances.
- The teacher's college major; whether the teacher has any advanced degrees, and, if so, the subject of the degrees.
- Whether any teachers' aides or similar paraeducators provide services to your child and, if they do, their qualifications.

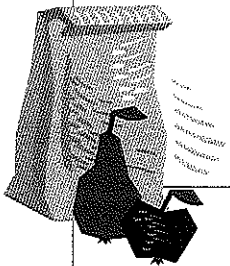
